At Common Ground Ecovillage, our Principles and Intentions (P&I's) are foundational, expressing our values and undergirding our plans and actions. At this time of explosive awareness of systemic racism in our culture, we share this call for change with you:

### P&I 28: We are committed to working for racial equity & for social & environmental justice.

We acknowledge racism in ourselves and in our society, and seek to overcome its harmful legacy in our relationships, our country, and on the land. Aspiring to create a racially inclusive community, we recognize that we can only achieve this goal by addressing our own racism and by working for racial justice. Aspiring to create a sustainable community, we recognize that true sustainability requires achieving harmony and justice – making ourselves a "beloved community" – both ecologically and socially.

These are not just words, but **deeply held commitments** centrally located in our vision. They
recognize that we are all implicated in systematic racial
prejudice and patterns of privilege that are often
invisible yet nonetheless pervasive, powerful and
destructive. At CGEV, we offer workshops and
resources to **raise awareness of systemic racism and open windows to action.** We'll be sharing more

learn, although a bit of business or financial acumen wouldn't be amiss. Don't be shy!

**Planning, Design, & Development:** PDD continues focused efforts to "Raising Sights:"

Water Independence: We are wrapping up our survey of options for this, getting into the nitty-gritty of regulatory requirements, and complex and not wholly reliable comparative cost data, but we're on it! Core Building Materials: We are delighted to report that we have narrowed our options to two—both mainly plant-based, locally sourced or possibly even from our own land. One is straw bale walls; the other "hempcrete" - shredded hemp-stalks mixed with a lime binder, a new and exciting method/product. These materials could be combined and would allow a good deal of do-it-yourself involvement without a lot of skill required. Both also have a distinctively earthy look and seem to best express our regenerative intentions. We are still gathering data—not easy to come by, as both methods are still definitely nontraditional today—and we're beginning to consider prototypes and demonstration builds. Stay tuned! Energy Independence: We're aiming to create our own photovoltaic-based electrical grid and disconnect (mostly) from grid power. After doing our own research, we have been seeking a professional consultant's help; but finding the right person has been tricky. Again, still at it. Know anyone? Master development plan: The General Circle asked us to look at alternatives to our approved plan just to get a sense of alternative options. PDD's commitment continues to be to the current development plan, potentially with the phased-build option that is now taking shape. A preliminary report will be discussed by GC in a special meeting in mid-July, and then the whole community is invited to the First Saturday in August event where PDD and Financial & Legal will present their ideas and ask for your input.
