Planning & Development: Very Big News!! Over the past many months, we have experienced several worrisome delays while our lender cleared away

what he felt could be significant hurdles to ensure that the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is sufficiently comfortable for us to commence the formal loan application process. We learned just last week that we can, at long last, move forward with the formalities of our loan application to fund construction or our dwellings and common house. Please understand that this does NOT mean we've secured a loan for our construction. We've been given the Green Light to proceed, and that alone is cause for much celebration! Thanks to generous matching funds from of our Catalyst member, we are well on track to raising the money to complete key pre-development activities, but more LLC investments will be needed. This journey towards approval of our loan has many steps and benchmarks and some are listed here:

- ◆Complete a formal Concept Meeting Proposal to meet with our lender and HUD representatives and pay a \$5,000 application fee.
- ♦ Hire a firm to carry out a Market Analysis
