• On the architecture side, we are nearing closure on the fundamentals of wall design using strawbales, and preparing to resume planning work for the Common House. The updated sample schematic residence design—for HUD submission—is largely done. We'll be updating all of the residence schematic designs after the Common House is done. • Financially, we've been able to carry this planning work so very far due to funds raised from members via the Catalyst Challenge Match. And please note: more Challenge match funds remain unclaimed! An investment of \$5000 will be matched 4-to-1 by the Catalyst – generating money we are definitely going to need, as none of the stages ahead will be cheap!
