Land Stewardship: In addition to the many "ongoings", the LSC: completed its review of 2020 and plans for early 2021; held a well-attended workday that included a mixture of stalwarts and new, bright eyed and bushy tailed co-conspirators that worked (mostly) on the barn, trails, muddy road, and new fence; continued with all things barn including planning for electrifying (figuratively and literally!) the barn, and hopefully including a photovoltaic array in the mix (stay tuned on how interested folks can support); and planted a few apple trees and planned for more plant companions. LSC also shared ideas with GC regarding a potential process for further articulation and exploration of membership support of the CGEV agrarian mission. January's activities and focus will continue in February. And, the LSC will quite likely "press pause" with trying to schedule anything new to focus on to provide space both for follow up and everything else transpiring with CGEV at the moment.

With the help of outside consultants and experts, we also continue to consolidate specific decisions on core building materials, photvoltaics, and other key infrastructure questions. In early 2021 we expect to revisit our schematic design portfolio (architecture) and return to our work of setting parameters for a comprehensive site plan and making a unit mix determination.
