select a suitable general contractor, and serve as Owner's Representative when we begin construction. She'll also bring an independent and up-to-date perspective on many aspects of the project. This will be a costly but crucial step which will require raising funds, though we'll be able to roll her costs into the big loan when we finally do achieve it. ♦ Speaking of the loan, the process continues to be slow but the loan originating company is very supportive and reassuring and we are making progress! Other financial aspects, such as a detailed Limited Equity proposal, are now taking shape as well. ♦ **Site engineering is nearly complete** except for the Common House which needs to be re-positioned due to the fact that the big oak tree can actually be saved. This is wonderful news overall...and very awkward at this stage...and of course we'll figure it out! ♦ With our architect we are just returning to the **Common House** for some significant redesign from the 2020 schematic plan. watch for more information on that shortly.

**Land Stewardship:** We're excited to be creating **two new Subcircles focusing on the Farm and Forest**. This will help us to better organize and direct our endeavors in these vital—but very—different areas. And, we are having conversations about task and role sharing for our “parent” Circle, **opening opportunities for people to get involved from near and far**. For example, someone local might regularly snap photos for the Almanac while another person, maybe at a distance, writes this Circle entry. Local members could work on forest thinning while others could look into coordinating the range of forest stewardship tasks from a distance. ♦ On the challenging side, the well water booster pump stopped working about a month ago. It was sent to Arizona for repair, a process masterfully expedited by Jeffry. Luckily, there was enough rain in July to avoid a big crop loss. The pump should be back and running by the time you read this Almanac. ♦ Doug has been in a conversation with a **microbiologist interested in identifying the specific micro-organisms in our soil**. This information would become part of the ongoing project to utilize the ash resulting from biochar burning of forest debris as fertilizer for our farm. ♦ Our “*Ailanthus* Taming” project continues as Randy and Hope continue to weed and treat skads of new Tree of Heaven small shoots emerging everywhere.
