Financial & Legal Subcircle: With Theresa's tireless leadership, we submitted an application for the Orange **County <u>HOME</u> grant**—a remarkable achievement! We requested \$280,000 to help our lower-income members pay for their share prices. Theresa, Robyn and Jane had two meetings with the Orange County Housing staff who were excited about our project and encouraged us to apply. Thirty-seven pages and dozens of attachments later, the application was done and off. Thanks to everyone who filled out the surveys and supplied your bios, worked on other questions, and helped upload attachments! Thanks for reviewing documents and suggesting alternative language. Thanks for putting together budgets and unearthing elevations and all of the myriad attachments requested. Thanks to Paul and Katy for their wisdom and support, and to Robyn for creating a ProForma, and Timeline, and Funding Sources, and knowing the correct language for so many of their questions that were a mystery to the rest of us.
