Introducing Compassion Corner—Making Life More Wonderful. This column offers bite-sized pieces to remind us of the NVC principles and practices that about 25 members learned over the 8-week course with Steve Torma. The first topic echoes recent teachings from Dusty Staub, who facilitated our Grounders meetings in Wintertime, and Steve Torma. Both of them recommended that we develop the habitual practice of appreciation. But how do we do that in a way that can be most meaningful to the recipient? How about trying this:

Replacing Compliments with Appreciations

In NVC, appreciation is understood to be a powerful substitute for compliments that feels wonderful for both the giver and receiver.

Invitation: Instead of a compliment like "You're so caring!", try offering a specific appreciation that includes an observation, the feelings it brings up, and a need that it meets, e.g., "When I think about how you offer rides or make food for a member in need, I feel a flush of warmth and gratitude, because it meets my needs for inspiration and a loving community."

Planning & Development

We now have our permits and site plan in

place! This puts us in a position to put the plans out for bidding to potential infrastructure contractors. This is a long lead-time process. If we are to begin building the infrastructure in the Fall (best time), we need to be starting the bidding process quite soon. At the moment it continues to hinge on our confidence in our financial capacity. P&D is working hard to finally decide the most workable ownership structure for moving ahead and to establish enough security about financing to set the wheels in motion. We must consider an upfront infrastructure loan and eventual individual construction-to-permanent mortgages, as well as potential external affordable-housing support. Financial & Legal Circle champions, Becky and Theresa, are hard at that work. Others are helping, too – and perhaps you?
