Compassion Corner: Making Life More Wonderful Governance & Communications Circle

This month's practice: Self-Empathy first!

Empathy is a foundational piece of NVC practice. When someone expresses a concern, criticism, anxiety, etc, we thank them for sharing and then we meet them with empathy, focused on impact rather than defending intentions and without having to agree with their perspective. Before we do this, it is essential to give ourselves empathy or request it from an empathy partner, because it is almost impossible to give empathy when we need it ourselves.

Invitation: This month let's practice pausing, checking in with ourselves, and making sure our own empathy tanks are full before offering it to others.

Planning & Development

This summer is the Season of Big Moves by P&D! Here is the briefest of overviews:

- ♦ Infrastructure construction is out for bids from contractors. They are due June 20th. Then, we have a month or so to select the best offer and negotiate with contractors to be sure the work can be done in a way that best suits our needs. Start times for actual construction are likely in the Fall, though it's also possible that we will need another round of bidding and perhaps revised conditions we'll see. Fingers crossed! Randy and Anthony are taking the lead with this alongside our site engineer, Bobby Tucker.
- ♦ Preparing hearts and minds: When we committed to going ahead with construction, we also committed to taking care and giving heart to preparing ourselves and the other creatures and the land, as best we can, for the disruptions and changes to come. Randy laid out a framework for this work: see this link. Janey, Doug, and others are helping move this forward.

♦ Common House: Another commitment is to prioritize Common House development. Lucas is taking the lead on this alongside Anthony, Kathleen, and Bradley. We have a rough design and are consulting with Greg Allen of the Muddauber School (yes it will be strawbale and clay) to get us enough of a workable plan that we can begin actual building (under our "bona fide farm" dispensation) soon.

- ◆ The Ownership structure is still not decided, mainly because we are still making every effort to establish a cooperative and stewardship model rather than the fee-simple, private-ownership model that is the usual default. Of course, we intend to foster a cooperative, stewardship culture in any case, but we'd much prefer that the legal setup reflect and support that culture rather than make it more difficult. Theresa, Becky, Dave and others lead this work.
- ◆ Lot preference survey: Meantime, however exactly ownership will be structured, we need to give prospective first-wave buyers/leasers a more definite sense of what lots to plan for. Some of us are already working on residence

- ♦ Financing: Key of course is identifying and organizing the financing, both external and internal, for this big step forward. Theresa and Becky have reestablished the Financial & Legal Subcircle, several new members have joined or consulted and we have just (re-)hired Robyn Heeks of Heeks Collective as a financial consultant and development co-manager to help pull us through this urgent and vital phase.
- ♦ Needless to say, and as you've heard many times already, all of this work could use more hands. This is an absolutely vital phase for building the village and reconstituting human and more than human communities around it. The people already actively involved are also stretched very thin. Once again, anyone interested in helping with the work is strongly encouraged to contact any of the folks just listed to volunteer! Contact Anthony to learn more.

In a time of such uncertainty, building intimate, loving, and playful relationships with the living Earth seems like the only way forward. Children are yearning for spaces where they can feel nourished by the goodness of the world and play their way into an experience of belonging.
